Foreword by Jane Davidson AM, Minister for Environment Sustainability and Housing

In April 2008, I launched the Tidy Towns programme, a two-part Welsh Assembly Government initiative between Keep Wales Tidy and all 22 local authorities. The aim of the project is to empower the people of Wales to take responsibility for the quality of their local environment. Keep Wales Tidy is responsible for the community engagement element of the initiative and has dedicated Tidy Towns Officers, covering every local authority to support the work. This has proved very successful, with 20,000 volunteers participating during 2008-09 and Keep Wales Tidy working in more areas of Wales than ever before.

Then in February 2009, Keep Wales Tidy published its first Cleanliness of Wales Report, based on scores obtained by using the Local Environmental Audit and Management System (LEAMS). The data included in this report provide both a baseline level of cleanliness for each local authority and national figures. As this important information develops and becomes more robust, it can be used to direct future improvements.

Other considerable successes achieved by Keep Wales Tidy this year include:

- Over 1,600 schools registered with the Eco-Schools Programme;
- Attracting over 40,000 volunteers during Tidy Wales Week and the Heads of the Valleys Spring Clean;
- Maintaining a high number of coastal awards on Welsh beaches and marinas – 47 Blue Flag Awards, 111 Seaside Awards and 46 Green Coast Awards; and
- Providing support for local authorities and organisations in both the private and voluntary sectors.

It is my pleasure to commend Keep Wales Tidy again this year. The achievements highlighted in this report demonstrate the importance of the organisation in improving the local environment in Wales.

Cefais y fraint, yn Ebrill 2008, o lansio'r rhaglen Trefi Taclus, sef menter ar y cyd gan Lywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru rhwng Cadwch Gymru'n Daclus a'r 22 Awdurdod Lleol yng Nghymru. Nod y prosiect yw galluogi pobl Cymru i ysgwyddo cyfrifoldeb am ansawdd eu hamgylchedd lleol. Cadwch Gymru'n Daclus sydd yn gweithredu'r elfen o'r fenter sydd yn ceisio cynnwys y cymunedau ac mae'n cyflogi swyddog prosiect Trefi Taclus ym mhob un o'r awdurdodau lleol i gefnogi'r gwaith. Bu hyn yn llwyddiant mawr oherwydd yn ystod 2008-09 bu 20,000 o wirfoddolwyr yn cydweithio gyda Cadwch Gymru'n Daclus mewn mwy o ardaloedd yng Nghymru nag erioed o'r blaen.

Yna yn Chwefror 2009, am y tro cyntaf erioed, cyhoeddodd Cadwch Gymru'n Daclus Adroddiad Glendid Cymru ar sail sgorau a gasglwyd drwy ddefnyddio'r System Reoli ar gyfer Archwilio'r Amgylcheddol Lleol. Mae'r data sydd yn yr adroddiad yn waelodlin o ran lefel glendid ar gyfer pob awdurdod lleol a hefyd yn nodi'r ffigurau ar lefel genedlaethol. Wrth i'r data pwysig hyn ddatblygu a dod yn gadarnach bydd modd eu defnyddio i ffurfio cyfeiriad gwelliannau yn y dyfodol.

Mae llwyddiannau eraill sylweddol Cadwch Gymru'n Daclus eleni'n cynnwys y canlynol:

- Cofrestrodd mwy na 1,600 o ysgolion gyda'r Rhaglen Eco-Sgolion;
- Denwyd mwy na 40,000 o wirfoddolwyr yn ystod Wythnos Cymru Daclus a Spring Clîn Blaenau'r Cymoedd;
- Eleni eto cafodd nifer helaeth o draethau a marinas Cymru wobrau arfordir – cafodd 47 y Faner Las, 111 y Wobr Glan Môr a 46 y Wobr Arfordir Glas; a
- Rhoddwyd cymorth i awdurdodau lleol a sefydliadau yn y sector preifat a'r sector gwirfoddol.

Chair and Chief Executive’s report

Introduction

The past year has seen significant change for Keep Wales Tidy, with a number of new programmes and activities being undertaken and an increase in our ability to support people across the whole of Wales to contribute towards achieving a clean, safe and tidy Wales.

Tidy Towns

The Tidy Towns programme is a new Welsh Assembly Government partnership programme between Keep Wales Tidy and the 22 Welsh Local Authorities. Keep Wales Tidy’s contribution has seen the establishment of officers in each local authority area whose main role is to support volunteers to take responsibility for their own local area. This work has built on the experience gained from successful programmes such as Clean Rivers, Clean Coasts and Pride in our Communities over many years. Tidy Towns has been very well received across Wales, with a wide number of organisations undertaking work to support the programme. The programme has exceeded expectations with over 20,000 volunteers participating in the programme. In order to achieve its Mission we will encourage other to engage in effective action to maintain a cleaner, safer, tidier Wales. This will involve encouraging people to behave in a responsible manner and to encourage people to take responsibility for their own local environment. Keep Wales Tidy will seek to identify and share good practice to ensure that it supports effective action.

Adroddiad y Cadeirydd a Prif Weithredwr

Cyflwyniad

Mae’r flwyddyn ddiwethaf wedi bod yn flwyddyn o newid mawr i Cadwch Gymru’n Daclus. Buom yn ymwneud â nifer o raglenni a gweithgareddau newydd ac rydym mewn gwell sefyllfa nac erioed i gefnogi pobl ar hyd a lled Cymru a chyfrannu tuag at gael Cymru lân, ddiogel a thaclus.

Trefi Taclus

Rhaglen bartneriaeth newydd gan Lywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru yw Trefi Taclus, ac mae’n cael ei rhedeg gan Cadwch Gymru’n Daclus mewn cydweithrediad â’r 22 Awdurdod Lleol yng Nghymru. Mae cyfraniad Cadwch Gymru’n Daclus wedi arwain at sefydlu swyddog ymhob ardal awdurdod lleol i fod yn bennaf gyfrifol am gefnogi gwirfoddolwyr i ysgwyddo’r cyfrifoldeb am eu hardal leol. Mae’r gwaith hwn wedi adeiladu ar y blynyddoedd o brofiad a fagwyd o redeg rhaglenni llwyddiannus megis Afonydd Glân, Gofal Arfordir a Balchder yn ein Cymunedau. Mae Trefi Taclus wedi cael croeso brwd ledled Cymru ac mae nifer fawr o sefydliadau yn cydweithio i gefnogi’r rhaglen. Mae’r rhaglen wedi gwneud yn llawer gwell na’r disgwyl hyd yn oed, ac mae mwy na 20,000 o wirfoddolwyr yn cymryd rhan. I gyflawni gofynion ein gorchwyl byddwn yn annog eraill i weithredu yn effeithiol i sicrhau Cymru lanach, diogel a thaclusach. Bydd hyn yn bosib drwy annog pobl i ymddwyn mewn modd cyfrifol tuag at eu hamgylchedd leol. Bydd Cadwch Gymru’n Daclus ym mynd ati i adnabod a rhannu arferion da i sicrhau cefnogaeth o weithredu’n effeithiol.

Cleanliness of Wales Report

In 2007, Keep Wales Tidy started a process of undertaking an annual cleanliness survey of all local authority areas. This work supported the new Streetscene performance indicator and enabled Keep Wales Tidy to produce the first Cleanliness of Wales report. The report provided a benchmark for the cleanliness of Wales and includes valuable details about the nature of littering in Wales, which can contribute towards the developing of strategies to improve the cleanliness of our nation.

The Eco-Schools Programme

The Eco-Schools programme continues to provide school pupils in Wales with the opportunity to identify environmental problems in their school and local area and to develop solutions. Over the coming years we will be working with pupils, teachers, Local Authorities and other partners to support schools to embed the programme into the work of schools and enable even more schools to achieve the International Green Flag.

Coastal Awards

This year saw over 110 beaches and marinas achieving awards in Wales, with 47 Blue Flags being awarded. This reflects the excellent work and investment undertaken to improve the water quality by Dŵr Cymru and land-based infrastructure by Local Authorities.

Adroddiad Glendid Cymru

Yn 2007, cychwynnodd Cadwch Gymru'n Daclus broses i gynnal arolwg glendid blynyddol o'r holl ardaloedd awdurdod lleol. Roedd y gwaith hwn yn cefnogi'r dangosydd perfformiad 'Strydlun' ac arweiniodd at gynhyrchu'r adroddiad Glendid Cymru cyntaf gan Cadwch Gymru'n Daclus. Rhoddodd yr adroddiad feincnod ar gyfer glendid Cymru ac mae'n cynnwys manylion defnyddiol iawn am natur sbwriel yng Nghymru y gellid eu defnyddio i gyfrannu at ddatblygu strategaethau i wella glendid ein cenedl.

Rhaglen Eco-Sgolion

Mae'r rhaglen Eco-Sgolion yn parhau i roi cyfle i ddisgyblion ysgol yng Nghymru i adnabod problemau amgylcheddol yn eu hysgol a'u hardal leol a meddwl sut i ddatrys y problemau hynny. Dros y blynyddoedd nesaf byddwn yn gweithio gyda disgyblion, athrawon, Awdurdodau Lleol a phartneriaid eraill i helpu ysgolion i gynnwys y rhaglen ym mhrif raglen waith yr ysgol a galluogi rhagor o ysgolion i ennill y Faner Werdd Rhyngwladol.

Gwobrau Arfordirol

Eleni, derbyniodd mwy na 110 o draethau a marinas yng Nghymru wob, a dyfarnwyd 47 Baner Las i gyd. Mae hyn yn adlewyrchu'r gwaith ardderchog a'r buddsoddiad sy'n cael ei wneud gan Dŵr Cymru, i wella ansawdd y dŵr, a chan Awdurdodau Lleol i wella'r isadeiledd ar dir sych.

Internal Work

As an organisation, KWT remains committed to achieving excellence and good practice. We retained our Investors in People Award, were awarded the Corporate Health Standard Bronze Award and were awarded a One Star recognition as part of the Best Companies accreditation scheme. We are working towards achieving the standards for Investing in Volunteer.

Keep Wales Tidy continued to receive extensive media coverage. Staff undertook over 100 interviews on TV and radio and over 600 articles about Keep Wales Tidy initiatives appeared in the local and national press. In addition, we undertook a process to develop a new corporate image.

Recognising Support

We would like to thank Jane Davidson AM, the Minister for Environment, Sustainability and Housing, and officers from the Welsh Assembly Government Local Environmental Quality Department for their active support during the year.

We also appreciate the support we have received from other departments of the Welsh Assembly Government such as Visit Wales, the Department of Economy and Transport, the Department of Children, Education, Lifelong Learning and Skills, the Department of Social Justice and Local Government and Assembly Sponsored Public Bodies such as the Countryside Council for Wales and Environment Agency Wales. This support recognises the cross-cutting importance of a clean, safe and tidy Wales. The support of the twenty two Local Authorities is also invaluable along with our numerous partners in the voluntary sector. From experience we know that working with partners gives us the best results and we value all these positive partnerships.

The success of Keep Wales Tidy is dependent on the hard work of both staff and volunteers. We would like to thank

Tidy Towns

Tidy Towns is a new, two-part initiative between Keep Wales Tidy and Welsh Local Authorities, funded primarily by the Welsh Assembly Government.

The project was launched by Jane Davidson, Minister for Environment, Sustainability and Housing in Newport in April 2008 and its aim is to **'support the people of Wales to take responsibility for the quality of their local environment so that they can contribute towards a Clean, Safe and Tidy Wales'**.

Keep Wales Tidy is delivering the community engagement element of the Initiative by employing a dedicated project officer for every Local Authority in Wales – a first for KWT! Officers work with local communities on a range of practical, environmental improvement projects including **community clean-ups, biodiversity enhancement, flytipping prevention, capacity-building and training for volunteers, Invasive species control, involvement of disengaged young people, habitat reclamation, access improvements and waste amnesties.**

Achievements during the reporting period:

- **577 groups** assisted to improve their environment
- **20,000 volunteers** taking part
- **4577 practical improvement events** were held
- **3402 clean-ups** resulting in the removal of 1218 tonnes and 28,679 bags of waste
- **64 large-scale partnership events** took place across Wales
- **248 events awareness-raising events** to show how people can get involved.

Trefi Taclus

Mae Trefi Taclus yn fenter newydd mewn dwy ran rhwng Cadwch Gymru'n Daclus ac Awdurdodau Lleol Cymru ac mae'n cael ei ariannu gan Lywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru'n bennaf.

Lansiwyd y prosiect yng Nghasnewydd yn Ebrill 2008 gan Jane Davidson, AC, y Gweinidog dros yr Amgylchedd, Cynaliadwyedd a Thai, a'i nod yw '**cynorthwyo pobl Cymru i ysgwyddo cyfrifoldeb am ansawdd eu hamgylchedd lleol fel y gallant gyfrannu tuag at Gymru Lân, Ddiogel a Thaclus**'.

Cadwch Gymru'n Daclus sydd yn gweithredu'r elfen o'r fenter sydd yn ceisio cynnwys y gymuned a gwneir hynny drwy gyflogi swyddog prosiect yn benodol ar gyfer y fenter hon ym mhob awdurdod lleol yng Nghymru - am y tro cyntaf yn hanes Cadwch Gymru'n Daclus! Mae'r swyddogion yn gweithio gyda'r cymunedau lleol ar nifer o brosiectau ymarferol i wella'r amgylchedd yn cynnwys **glanhau ardaloedd, gwella'r fioamrywiaeth, atal tipio anghyfreithlon, adeiladu capasiti a chyflwyno hyfforddiant i wirfoddolwyr, rheoli rhywogaethau ymledol, cynnwys pobl ifanc sydd wedi ymddieithrio, adfer cynefinoedd, gwella mynediad ac amnestau gwastraff.**

Yn ystod y cyfnod y mae'r adroddiad hwn amdano cyflawnwyd y canlynol:

- **bu 577 o grwpiau'n** helpu i wella eu hamgylchedd
- **bu 20,000 o wirfoddolwyr** yn cymryd rhan
- cynhaliwyd **4577 o ddigwyddiadau ymarferol**
- cynhaliwyd **3402 o sesiynau glanhau** a chliriwyd 1218 o dunelli, a 28,679 llond bag o wastraff
- cynhaliwyd **64 o ddigwyddiadau mawr gan bartneriaethau** ledled Cymru
- cynhaliwyd **248 o ddigwyddiadau i godi ymwybyddiaeth** i ddangos sut y gall pobl gymryd rhan.



“Once upon a time there was a small ex-mining valley which had been forgotten by everybody. There was no work, therefore shops closed. Then one day something happened: residents were encouraged to try and help their community. This was when Keep Wales Tidy came into our lives. A committee was formed from people who wanted to make the valley green again, and was assisted by Keep Wales Tidy who gave sound advice and practical help. We started with just six people; now we have in the region of 20 helpers at our clean-ups. This initiative has brought many people together who would never have known each other otherwise. Many people have gained confidence and can talk directly with representatives from councils. We are going from strength to strength thanks to KWT.”

Pat Freke – Evanstown Voluntary Organisation (Bridgend)

“The children really enjoy litter picking and are becoming more aware of the difference they can make to their environment. Recently, more parents are getting involved as well, and the Tidy Towns activities are helping to strengthen the community. The amount of rubbish we collect is reducing and we no longer get passers by telling us we’re wasting our time!

“As well as litter picking, we planted daffodil bulbs on the main approach to Flint Castle, which really cheered the estate up in the spring. It’s a great chance to meet new people and share ideas and experiences. I’ve thoroughly enjoyed being part of the Tidy Towns project, and I’m very proud of what we have achieved on the Castle Estate.”

Norah Williams – Castle Estate, Flintshire

“Amser maith yn ôl roedd cwm a fu gynt yn ardal lofaol ond a anghofwyd yn llwyr. Doedd dim gwaith a chaeodd y siopau. Yna un diwrnod digwyddodd rhywbeth: cafodd y trigolion eu hannog i geisio helpu eu cymuned. Dyna pryd y daeth Cadwch Gymru’n Daclus i’n bywydau. Ffurfiwyd pwyllgor o bobl oedd yn awyddus i droi’r cwm yn wyrdd unwaith eto a chafwyd cyngor gwerthfawr a chymorth ymarferol gan Cadwch Gymru’n Daclus. Dim ond chwech o bobl oedd yn y grŵp i gychwyn ond erbyn hyn mae rhyw 20 o bobl yn dod at ei gilydd i helpu yn ein sesiynau glanhau. Mae’r fenter wedi dod â llawer o bobl ynghyd, pobl na fyddai fel arall wedi cyfarfod. Mae llawer o bobl wedi magu hunanhyder ac maent yn medru siarad â chynrychiolwyr y cynghorau. Rydym yn mynd o nerth i nerth ac mae’r diolch i Cadwch Gymru’n Daclus.”

Pat Freke – Mudiad Gwirfoddol Tre Ifan (Pen-y-bont ar Ogwr)

“Mae’r plant yn mwynhau casglu sbwriel ac maent yn dod yn fwy ymwybodol o’r gwahaniaeth y medrant ei wneud i’r amgylchedd. Mae mwy o rieni’n ymuno yn y gwaith yn ddiweddar ac mae gweithgareddau Trefi Taclus yn helpu i gryfhau’r gymuned. Mae llai o sbwriel i’w gasglu ac erbyn hyn does neb yn dweud wrth ein gweld yn gweithio ein bod yn gwastraffu ein hamser!

“Yn ogystal â chasglu sbwriel rydym wedi plannu bylbiau cennin pedr ar y ffordd sydd yn arwain at Gastell y Fflint ac roedd y blodau’n codi calon pawb ar y stad yn y gwanwyn. Mae’n braf cael cwrdd â phobl newydd a rhannu syniadau a phrofiadau. Rydw i wedi mwynhau bod yn rhan o’r prosiect Trefi Taclus ac rydw i’n falch iawn o’r hyn rydyn ni wedi ei gyflawni ar Stad y Castell.”

Norah Williams – Stad y Castell, Sir y Fflint

“Two years ago I heard that the Council wanted to build 320 houses on our only green spaces in North Ely – I was totally devastated. I used these fields as a child, and so did my children who are now adults. So we formed a group called The Ely Garden Villagers. People were too afraid to take their children to the fields due to the stolen cars which were being burnt out there. We worked with the Arson Reduction Team to put bollards in place. It’s been over 18 months since the bollards have been erected and the result has been amazing with no more stolen, burnt out cars. The community cannot believe the change, not just in our fields, but also in people’s attitudes. We contacted Tidy Towns and spoke to Indeg Jones who was also amazing. The first event removed 25 tonnes of rubbish and the residents were very pleased with the result. That was seven months ago and apart from two incidents (which were quickly sorted) the site remains spotless.

“It is so rewarding to see the children enjoying themselves and knowing they have something to look forward to other than hanging around the streets. The atmosphere in Ely has totally changed. It took the threat of losing our fields to pull a community closer together. We now have a cleaner and a friendlier community and a lot more people have got to know one another. I for one am proud to say I live in Ely and could not be prouder to say Ely people truly do stick together.”

Eco-Schools

The International Eco-Schools programme continues to be an extremely successful programme across Wales with over 90% of schools actively involved.

Funding from the Welsh Assembly Government’s Environment Division, the Countryside Council for Wales and Waste Awareness Wales enabled the Eco-Schools team to make over 500 school visits and provide workshops and teacher training sessions on a range of themes.

The support provided has meant that pupils, teachers, parents and the wider community have been able to undertake some excellent activities, on their own and with a host of partners, to

Pupils have become involved with local businesses looking to reduce their Carbon Footprint by electing to use financial offset contributions to plant wildlife areas within school grounds.

The programme is also seen as an excellent tool for inclusivity within schools. **The most important contribution to school life has been that, while it (Eco-Schools Programme) provides opportunities for all to get involved and certainly educates the whole school on sustainability, it also provides an opportunity for pupils who have a real passion for protecting the environment with a chance to succeed above and beyond the traditional classroom environment.**

Young Reporters for the Environment

Young Reporters for the Environment (YRE) is one of the five programmes promoted by the Foundation for Environment Education (FEE) and the current pilot project is funded by the Countryside Council for Wales.

This international programme is designed to empower young citizens in secondary schools to investigate and report on local environmental issues. Every year an international competition takes place, the YRE Awards. Schools can work at a National or an International level and can choose from eight topics: Agriculture and Nature, Water, Waste, Energy, Climate Change, Coastline, Cities and Biodiversity.

The Welsh pilot project invited seven secondary schools to investigate the topic of Biodiversity. Five articles were submitted to the National Jury and the winner was an article called 'Alien Invasion' by pupils from Ysgol Brynhyfryd in Denbighshire. The runner up, 'Hedgehogs in Hiding', was written by pupils from Ysgol Dinas Bran, also in Denbighshire.

The two articles were then submitted to the International Jury to be judged and will be published in the annual YRE book.

Mae'r rhaglen rhyngwladol wedi cynllunio i alluogi dinasyddion ifanc o fewn ysgolion cyfun i edrych i mewn ac adrodd am ddigwyddiadau amgylcheddol. Pob blwyddyn cynhelir cystadleuaeth rhyngwladol, sef Gwobr y GIA. Bydd ysgolion yn gallu gweithio ar lefel Cenedlaethol neu Rhyngwladol a bydd dewis o wyth pwnc: Amaeth a Natur, Dŵr, Gwastraff, Newid yn yr Hinsawdd, Arfordir, Dinasoedd a Bioamrywiaeth.

A'r gyfer y peilot Cymreig gwahoddwyd saith ysgol i edrych mewn i Bioamrywiaeth. Fe anfonwyd pump erthygl i'r Rheithgor Cenedlaethol a'r ennillwyr oedd Ysgol Brynhyfryd yn Nimbych ar y pwnc o 'Fewnlfifiad Estronol'. Yn yr ail safle roedd Ysgol Dinas Bran o Ddinbych, gyda 'Draenogod yn Llechu'.

Local Environmental Audit and Management Systems (LEAMS)

A survey which is an independent validation of the cleanliness of the streets across the 22 local authorities, was undertaken using the Local Environmental Audit and Management System (LEAMS).

The surveyors undertook two 4% surveys in each local authority area to allow for seasonal variations. They also recorded information on the amount of graffiti, fly-posting, detritus, dog fouling and weeds found on the streets surveyed.

Each Local Authority is sent an individual report and the data and information from these is used to produce an all Wales report.

Preliminary findings for 2008–2009 show a minor reduction in the amount of smoking related litter from an average of 90% to 86%, but it is still the most common type of litter found on our streets. Last year’s All Wales LEAMS report is available on Keep Wales Tidy’s website. A first for the LEAMS process this year was a survey using pedal rather than motor power. The story below tells you more...

Midway through the year the LEQ team started to consider ways to lessen the team’s carbon footprint. On average the team visit over 3200 streets as part of the LEAMS surveys. It was decided that one way to make a start was by abandoning cars in favour of a day’s cycling. The centre of Cardiff seemed the obvious starting point.

System Archwilio a Rheoli’r Amgylchedd Lleol (SARAL)

Defnyddiwyd System Archwilio a Rheoli’r Amgylchedd Lleol, (SARAL), i gynnal arolwg, sy’n rhoi barn annibynnol am lendid strydoedd, mewn 22 o ardaloedd awdurdod lleol.

Cynhaliodd yr arolygwyr ddau arolwg 4% ym mhob ardal awdurdod lleol er mwyn cymryd i ystyriaeth amrywiadau tymhorol. Cofnodwyd gwybodaeth hefyd am faint o graffiti, posteri di-ganiatâd, detritws, baw cŵn a chwyn a oedd ar y strydoedd a archwiliwyd.

Anfonir adroddiad unigol at bob Awdurdod Lleol a defnyddir y data a’r wybodaeth o’r rhain er mwyn cynhyrchu adroddiad ar gyfer Cymru gyfan.

Mae’r canlyniadau cychwynnol ar gyfer 2008–2009 yn dangos peth lleihad mewn sbwriel sy’n gysylltiedig ag ysmegu gyda’r cyfartaledd yn gostwng o 90% i 86%, ond dyma yw’r math mwyaf cyffredin o sbwriel sydd ar ein strydoedd yn dal i fod. Mae’r adroddiad SARAL ar gyfer Cymru gyfan y llynedd ar gael ar wefan Cadwch Gymru’n Daclus. Am y tro cyntaf erioed, cyflwynwyd arolwg ar gefn beic yn hytrach na mewn ceir i fod yn rhan o’r broses SARAL. Mae’r stori isod yn egluro ymhellach...

Hanner ffordd trwy’r flwyddyn dechreuodd y tîm Ansawdd yr Amgylchedd Lleol ystyried ffyrdd o leihau eu hól troed carbon. Mae’r tîm yn ymweld â mwy na 3200 o strydoedd ar gyfartaledd wrth gynnal arolygon SARAL. Penderfynwyd mai un syniad fyddai defnyddio beiciau yn hytrach na cheir. Canol Caerdydd oedd y man cychwyn amlwg.





Jake, a member of the team involved commented:

"It had been a while since I'd used my bike and I must say the 20p per mile incentive did push me in the right direction. Keep Wales Tidy made a saving too, paying half of what it would have cost had I used a car. The cycle survey ended with a feeling of tiredness but also satisfaction."

Policy documents

A number of policy papers with recommendations were produced, which if implemented could have beneficial effects on litter, fly-tipping and the general local environmental quality.

- **Fast food litter**, which provides explanations as to the rise in fast food litter, describes the implications of such litter and explores the various initiatives that have been implemented to tackle the issue, and makes recommendations aimed at local government and fast food industry.
- **Balloon Litter** examined the damage to wildlife caused by litter from the intentional act of releasing balloons into the environment, which is usually done during fundraising events.
- **Recycling bins – Recycling on the go**, which observes that Wales has an undeveloped culture of 'recycling on the go' and that there is no national strategy for on street recycling provision. The paper highlighted the existing initiatives and how we could address some of the issues related to recycling on the go.
- **Litter and fly-tipping on private land**, which attempted to cover the main issues around large accumulations of litter and fly-tipping on private land, including the impact this has on local environmental quality, what legislation is in place to deal with the problem, local case studies, and actions adopted by local authorities and the Environment Agency.

Cynhyrwyd nifer o bapurau polisi gydag argymhellion a fyddai, o gael eu gweithredu, yn gallu cael effeithiau cadarnhaol iawn ar sbwriel, tipio anghyfreithlon ac ansawdd yr amgylchedd lleol yn gyffredinol.

- **Sbwriel bwyd cyflym** sy'n rhoi eglurhad am y cynnydd yn y math hwn o sbwriel a disgrifiad o'i effeithiau yn ogystal â nodi'r amrywiol fentrau sydd wedi eu cychwyn er mwyn mynd i'r afael â'r broblem a chynnig argymhellion i lywodraeth leol a'r diwydiant bwyd cyflym.
- **Sbwriel balwŷns**, sy'n edrych ar effaith sbwriel o'r fath ar fywyd gwyllt o ganlyniad i ryddhau balwŷns i'r awyr yn fwriadol at ddibenion codi arian.
- **Biniau ailgylchu – Ailgylchu wrth fynd**, sy'n nodi nad oes diwylliant cryf o ailgylchu wrth fynd yng Nghymru ac nad oes strategaeth genedlaethol ar gyfer darparu adnoddau ailgylchu ar strydoedd. Mae'r papur yn tynnu sylw at gynlluniau sy'n bodoli'n barod a sut y gellid mynd i'r afael â rhai o'r materion sy'n ymwneud ag ailgylchu wrth fynd.
- **Sbwriel a thipio anghyfreithlon ar dir preifat** a gynhyrwyd er mwyn trafod y prif broblemau'n ymwneud â sbwriel difrifol a thipio anghyfreithlon ar dir preifat, yn cynnwys yr effaith ar ansawdd yr amgylchedd lleol, pa ddeddfwriaeth sy'n bodoli er mwyn mynd i'r afael â'r broblem, astudiaethau achos lleol a chamau a fabwysiadwyd gan awdurdodau lleol ac Asiantaeth yr Amgylchedd.



Special Projects

Design

During our LEAMS surveys officers identify design features such as: tree guards and utility boxes which trap litter; public/private interfaces where a lack of natural surveillance has led to vandalism; and paving materials that have proved difficult to clean.

This information inspired the production of a policy paper in 2007 on Design and Litter. This in turn led to a one year project, funded by a Welsh Assembly Government LEQ grant to produce supplementary guidance to provide examples of good design practice and to use the expertise of cleansing staff in the design process to reduce the problems identified. Copies of the guidance and a summary leaflet are available on Keep Wales Tidy's website.

Surveying Multi-Use Networks

In March 2009 a bid was made to the Welsh Assembly Government's LEQ fund to develop a methodology for surveying and managing the local environmental quality (LEQ) of the National Cycle Network (NCN), which is a multi-use route for a variety of users including the disabled and walkers. The project will cover two pilot areas in east and west Wales but the final product should be suitable for all off-road sections of the National Cycle Network in Wales. This project is a joint venture between Keep Wales Tidy and Sustrans.

Prosiectau Arbennig

Dylunio

Yn ystod ein harolygon LEAMS, mae swyddogion yn adnabod elfennau'n ymwneud â dylunio megis: cewyll coed a chypyrddau cyfleustodau sy'n trapiu sbwriel; manau rhyngwyneb cyhoeddus/preifat lle mae diffyg goruchwyliaeth naturiol wedi arwain at fandaliaeth; a deunyddiau palmantu sy'n anodd eu glanhau.

Arweiniodd yr wybodaeth hon at gynhyrchu papur polisi yn 2007 ar Ddylunio a Sbwriel. Ymhen amser, datblygwyd prosiect blwyddyn, wedi'i ariannu gan grant Ansawdd yr Amgylchedd Lleol Llywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru i gynhyrchu canllawiau atodol er mwyn darparu enghreifftiau o arfer da mewn perthynas ag arferion dylunio da a defnyddio arbenigedd staff glanhau yn ystod y broses ddylunio gyda'r nod o leihau'r problemau a adnabuwyd. Mae copïau o'r canllawiau a thaflen am y cynllun ar gael ar wefan Cadwch Gymru'n Daclus.

Arolygon Rhwydweithiau Aml-ddefnydd

Ym mis Mawrth 2009 gwnaed cais i gronfa Ansawdd yr Amgylchedd Lleol Llywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru i ddatblygu methodoleg ar gyfer arolygu a rheoli ansawdd amgylchedd lleol y Rhwydwaith Beicio Cenedlaethol, sef llwybr aml-ddefnydd ar gyfer pob math o ddefnyddwyr yn cynnwys yr anabl, beicwyr a cherddwyr. Bydd y prosiect yn cael ei gynnal mewn dwy ardal beilot yn nwyrain a gorllewin Cymru ond dylai fod y cynllun terfynol yn addas ar gyfer pob rhan o'r Rhwydwaith yng Nghymru sydd oddi ar ffordd. Mae'r prosiect hwn yn fenter ar y cyd rhwng Cadwch Gymru'n Daclus a Sustrans.

Campaigns

Fast food Litter – explicitly targeted was fast food litter associated with the night time economy. Its focus was a relatively young audience, which Keep Wales Tidy understood to be the main consumers of fast food. The campaign centred on bus backs and posters and coincided with the surge in night time activity around Christmas.

Graffiti – was targeted in March 2009, when Keep Wales Tidy launched a campaign “Graffiti – Crime not Art” to highlight the problems blighting many of our streets. An action plan and leaflet were produced to explain the law and to suggest ways to tackle the problem.

Ymgyrchoedd

Sbwriel bwyd cyflym – targedwyd y math hwn o sbwriel, sy’n gysylltiedig â’r economi min nos. Y ffocws oedd cynulleidfa gymharol ifanc, sef y rhai a adnabuwyd i fod y mwyaf tebygol o brynu bwyd parod. Roedd yr ymgyrch yn ymwneud yn bennaf â hysbysebion cefn bws a phosteri i gydfynd â phrysurdeb min nos o amgylch y Nadolig.

Graffiti – targedwyd ym Mawrth 2009, pan lansiodd Cadwch Gymru’n Daclus ymgyrch “Graffiti – Trosedd nid Celf” i dynnu sylw at y problemau sy’n difwyno nifer fawr o’n strydoedd. Cynhyrchwyd cynllun gweithredu a thaflen er mwyn egluro’r gyfraith ac awgrymu ffyrdd o daclo’r problem.

Blue Flag

Environment, Sustainability and Housing Minister, Jane Davidson announced in a ceremony in Port Talbot that 42 Welsh beaches and five marinas were included in the list of locations in 36 countries across the world being recognised for having met the strict bathing water and land-based criteria required to achieve the much sought after Blue Flag status.

Three beaches made their first appearance in the list and amongst them was the three-mile long Aberavon beach best known in the 60s and 70s as the Mecca for beach loving South Wales miners and their families. But to mark the new millennium, Neath Port Talbot Council undertook a massive beach front regeneration programme and their investment has resulted in it being included in the roll call of the world’s top leisure destination.

Also making the list for the first time is Church Bay on Anglesey which can lay claim to being the location of the last thatched cottage on the island, and Newport beach in Pembrokeshire which is overlooked by the medieval Norman castle.

Beaches were judged against a total of 29 criteria which included reaching the highest water quality, good litter management, provision of information, strict dog controls and sustainable environmental management. Marinas will have met 16 land-based criteria that include reception

Y Faner Las

Cyhoeddodd Jane Davidson, y Gweinidog dros yr Amgylchedd, Cynaliadwyedd a Thai mewn seremoni ym Mhort Talbot bod 42 o draethau a phum marina yng Nghymru ar y rhestr o fannau mewn 36 o wledydd sydd yn cael eu cydnabod am gwrdd â’r meini prawf llym sydd yn ymwneud â’r dŵr ymdrochi a phethau ar y tir er mwyn cael statws Baner Las.

Mae tri o draethau ar y rhestr am y tro cyntaf ac yn eu mysg mae traeth Aberafan sydd yn dair milltir o hyd ac a oedd yn Feca i lowyr De Cymru a’u teuluoedd yn y 60au a’r 70au. Aeth Cyngor Castell-nedd Port Talbot ati i nodi’r mileniwm drwy gynnal rhaglen o waith i adfer y traeth ac mae eu buddsoddiad wedi ei wneud yn un o brif gyrchfannau gwyliau’r byd.

Traeth arall a enillodd y Faner Las am y tro cyntaf eleni yw Porth Swtan ar Ynys Môn lle mae bwthyn to gwellt olaf yr ynys, a thraeth Trefdraeth yn Sir Benfro gyda’r castell Normanaidd gerllaw.

Cafodd y traethau eu beirniadu yn ôl 29 o feini prawf sydd yn cynnwys ansawdd dŵr o’r safon uchaf, rheoli sbwriel, darparu gwybodaeth, rheoli cŵn a rheoli amgylcheddol cynaliadwy. Bydd y marinas wedi diwallu gofynion 16 o feini prawf sydd yn cynnwys cyfleusterau derbyn ar gyfer gwastraff peryglus,

facilities for hazardous waste, adequate lifesaving equipment and a commitment to safeguard their local environment.

The award is managed in Wales, on behalf of the Denmark based Foundation for Environmental Education, by Keep Wales Tidy. The Beach Awards Co-ordinator said: "Much has been achieved by Local Authorities and Welsh Water in improving the quality of our bathing water and upgrading land based infrastructure but we have some way to go before every beach and marina in Wales can claim to be clean and safe. We are very reliant on the tourism industry and if we are to meet the high standards demanded by our beach visitors every person in Wales has a role to play."

Green Coast Award

Representatives from award winning beaches in Wales and Ireland gathered on a windy Harlech beach to hear that 46 rural Welsh beaches and 14 Irish beaches were amongst the record list of rural beaches to be recognised for their natural beauty, clean environment and for having reached the highest bathing water quality.

The Green Coast Award was introduced in Wales in 1999 by Keep Wales Tidy and it recognises beaches prized for their natural, unspoilt environment which do not have the built infrastructure necessary to meet the criteria associated with more urban beaches. The project was later adopted in Ireland.

Emphasis is also placed on local community involvement in the ongoing and long term care of the award beach. This will include the removal of litter from their beach and identifying sites of ecological and historical interest and ensuring that the highest environmental standards are maintained.

Tegryn Jones, Chief Executive of Keep Wales Tidy commented: “Many people enjoy a beach experience far removed from the intrusions normally associated with the traditional and more urban beaches. They need look no further than the 2008 crop of Green Coast Award winning beaches. At most of the beaches you will find a dedicated group of volunteers and this award is testimony to their dedication.”

Pembrokeshire topped the list with 15 award winning beaches closely followed by Anglesey with 13 beaches. Gwynedd six, Swansea five, Ceredigion four, Vale of Glamorgan two and Conwy one. The list of award winning beaches for 2008 is shown on the Keep Wales Tidy website.

Seaside Award

Church Bay on Anglesey, once voted the most beautiful in Wales and the location of the island's last thatched crofting longhouse, achieved the ultimate accolade when it joined the impressive list of Welsh beaches that qualified to fly the coveted blue and yellow Seaside Award Resort flag.

To achieve Seaside Award status the award winning beaches will have attained the European Union minimum standard of bathing water quality and met a long list of strictly monitored land based criteria.

More than half of the applicants will have also met the much stricter Guideline water quality. All of them will also have satisfied the judges that the standard of their built infrastructure and overall management is also of a consistent high standard.

Of the 111 beaches announced for Wales, 61 were awarded to 'rural' beaches that will have met 13 land based criteria. The remaining 50 beaches are classified as 'resort' beaches and

For their efforts during ‘Tidy Wales Week 2008’ residents at the **Tudno/Emrys Estate** in Swansea won the top prize in the Biggest Tidy Wales Week event category and were presented with the **‘Dŵr Cymru Community Award’**.

Regulars at the awards ceremony are the **Cwmcelyn Tenants and Residents Association** from Blaenau Gwent and they were the winners in the Long Term Effort category. Formed in 2001 they have been busy building bridges, planting hundreds of trees and erecting fencing at various locations in the area. The transformation of a neglected park and an ancient woodland resulted in the **Old Colwyn Environment Federation** in the County of Conwy winning the Tourism Industry category. They were presented with the newly-commissioned **‘Vale Hotel Award’**.

John Adkins from Torfaen joins the special breed of award winning individuals who take it upon themselves to improve their local environment. For the past five years John has given up much of his spare time to carry out litter picking, vegetation management and path and pond construction in his patch.

Since late 2007 **Kelda Water Services Wales** staff in Newport have dedicated over 400 man hours to community projects and their commitment to improving their localities resulted in them winning the Business category. They were presented with the Sue Humphrey Memorial Award.

An excellent example of young people being good citizens was demonstrated by the winners in the Community

They meet once a week to clean up the coastline between Cardigan and Aberystwyth. To date they have collected over 1,386 bags of litter, as well as maintaining footpaths and steps leading down to Mwnt beach.

There were double celebrations for the **Aman Valley Conservation Association** who won the River Improvement category, receiving a cheque for £500 and the Bernard Jones Memorial trophy. The group were also judged worthy winners of the overall Tidy Wales Award Trophy.

Chris Mills, Director, Environment Agency Wales, said, "There has been excellent work done by many dedicated groups and individuals around Wales. I would like to congratulate not only the winners, but everyone who entered, as they all worked tirelessly to improve our environment. They can all deservedly feel proud of themselves."

Enillwyr y categori Gwella Traeth oedd **Hafan Hedd** yng Ngheredigion. Sefydlwyd y grŵp yn y flwyddyn 2005 ac mae'n cynnwys staff a chleientiaid Tîm Iechyd Meddwl Cymunedol Ceredigion. Maent yn cwrdd unwaith yr wythnos i glirio'r arfordir rhwng Aberteifi ac Aberystwyth. Hyd yma maent wedi casglu llond mwy na 1,386 o fagiau o sbwriel ac wedi cynnal llwybrau troed a'r grisiau sydd yn mynd i lawr i draeth y Mwnt.

Roedd yr achlysur yn ddathliad dwbl i **Gymdeithas Cadwraeth Cwm Aman**, sef enillwyr y categori Gwella Afon, gan iddynt dderbyn y siec am £500 a thlws coffa Bernard Jones am ddod i'r brig yn eu categori. Hwy hefyd oedd enillwyr y wobwr fawr sef Tlws Gwobr Cymru Daclus.

Dywedodd Chris Mills, Cyfarwyddwr Asiantaeth yr Amgylchedd Cymru, "Mae llawer o grwpiau ac unigolion ymroddedig iawn yng Nghymru wedi gwneud gwaith ardderchog. Hoffwn longyfarch yr enillwyr, a hefyd y cystadleuwyr eraill, gan eu bod i gyd wedi gweithio'n ddiflino i wella'u hamgylchedd. Mae ganddynt bob lle i ymfalchïo yn eu gwaith."

Tidy Wales Week

Tidy Wales Week 2008 saw 30,000 volunteers of all ages do their bit to clean up their neighbourhood, and as a result many long standing litter black spots across Wales were removed.

To assist groups to take part, Keep Wales Tidy produced 1000 free clean-up kits, sponsored by Visit Wales and Environment Agency Wales. The kits were put to good use, with hundreds of bags of litter being collected from over 700 locations.

A number of flagship events took place over Wales, starting with the launch event at Swansea Bay. Jane Davidson, Minister for Environment, Sustainability and Housing joined in with the activities and viewed the extent of the litter problem along the coast.

Not only had the litter become an eyesore, but it was also having an impact on the local wildlife and community. Volunteers from Ffynone Trust School, Mumbles Development Trust and the University of Swansea joined Keep Wales Tidy and the City and County of Swansea Council to carry out the beach clean.

Tidy Wales Week also saw the opening of a Visitor attraction on the Berwick Levels in Llanelli, to raise awareness of the protected water vole. Volunteers from the Watervole Action Group, Carmarthenshire County Council, CCW, Environment Agency Wales, Wildfowl and Wetlands Trust and CAVS joined forces with Keep Wales Tidy to carry out a final cleanup of the site that was once a severe flytipping hotspot.

Other events included a blitz of Rhyl, a cleanup of The Walks Estate in Flintshire, a large scale cleanup of the Taff Trail, River Taff and its banks between the weir and Dixon Street Bridge in Merthyr Tydfil, removing over a tonne of waste. Volunteers in West Wales decided to tackle a flytip in Devon Drive, Pembroke, removing a skip full of waste and 130 bags.

Wythnos Cymru Daclus

Yn ystod Wythnos Cymru Daclus 2008 bu 30,000 o wirfoddolwyr o bob oed yn gwneud eu rhan i lanhau eu hardaloedd ac o ganlyniad i'r gwaith cliriwyd llawer o'r mannau yng Nghymru lle'r oedd sbwriel ar ei waethaf.

Er mwyn helpu grwpiau i gymryd rhan cynhyrchodd Cadwch Gymru'n Daclus 1000 o becynnau clirio, a noddwyd gan Croeso Cymru ac Asiantaeth yr Amgylchedd Cymru. Gwnaed digon o ddefnydd o'r pecynnau a chasglwyd llond cannoedd o fagiau o sbwriel o fwy na 700 o leoliadau.

Trefnodd Cadwch Gymru'n Daclus nifer o ddiwyddiadau amlwg drwy Gymru gan gychwyn â'r digwyddiad lansio ym Mae Abertawe. Ymunodd Jane Davidson, y Gweinidog dros yr Amgylchedd, Cynaliadwyedd a Thai, yn y gwaith a gwelodd gymaint yw'r broblem sbwriel ar yr arfordir.

Mae'r sbwriel yn hyll i'r llygad ond mae hefyd yn peryglu'r bwyd gwyllt a'r gymuned leol. Ymunodd gwirfoddolwyr o Ysgol Ymddiriedolaeth Ffynone, Ymddiriedolaeth Datblygu'r Mwmbwls a Phrifysgol Abertawe â Cadwch Gymru'n Daclus a Chyngor Dinas a Sir Abertawe i glirio'r traeth.

Yn ystod wythnos Cymru Daclus hefyd agorwyd atyniad i Ymwelwyr yn y Ferwig, Llanelli, i godi ymwybyddiaeth o'r Llygoden Ddŵr sydd yn rhywogaeth a warchodir. Ymunodd gwirfoddolwyr o'r Grŵp Gweithredu Llygod Dŵr, Cyngor Sir Gaerfyrddin, y Cyngor Defnyddwyr Dŵr, Asiantaeth yr Amgylchedd Cymru, Ymddiriedolaeth Adar y Gwlypdir a Chymdeithas Gwasanaethau Gwirfoddol Sir Gaerfyrddin â Cadwch Gymru'n Daclus i glirio, unwaith ac am byth, y safle a fu unwaith yn un o'r mannau lle'r oedd tipio anghyfreithlon ar ei waethaf.

Ymysg y gwaith arall a gyflawnwyd gwnaed gwaith clirio mawr yn y Rhyl, glanhawyd Stad y Walks yn Sir y Fflint,

Keep Wales Tidy also joined forces with staff from the Environment Agency, and local volunteers from Cymmer Communities First, Rhondda Cynon Taff People First, McDonald's and Rhondda Cynon Taff Waste Busters to clean up the river bank of the Rhondda Fawr at Porth. The aim of the high profile event was to remove the unsightly rubbish accumulated along the riverside and remove larger items found in the river.

Ymunodd Cadwch Cymru'n Daclus hefyd â staff Asiantaeth yr Amgylchedd a gwirfoddolwyr lleol o Cymunedau'n Gyntaf y Cymer, Pobl yn Gyntaf Rhondda Cynon Taf, McDonald's a thîm y Wastebusters yn Rhondda Cynon Taf i glirio glannau'r Rhondda Fawr yn y Porth. Nod y digwyddiad mawr hwn oedd clirio'r blerwch a oedd wedi ymgasglu ar hyd glan yr afon a chodi eitemau mawr o'r afon.

Cleaner, Greener, Communities

The Cleaner Greener Communities project was established as a partnership project between Keep Wales Tidy, BTCV Cymru and Groundwork Wales.

The main aim of the project is to improve the quality of the Heads of the Valleys area by empowering local communities to take responsibility for their local environment. **A total of 73 community groups were engaged in the project.**

The three partners had different roles; **Keep Wales Tidy** was the lead partner, responsible for project finances and reporting. They also mobilised communities to identify and respond to eyesores and were responsible for overseeing clean up programmes. **Groundwork Wales** implemented

Cymunedau Glanach a Gwyrddach

Prosiect partneriaeth yw Cymunedau Glanach a Gwyrddach rhwng Cadwch Gymru'n Daclus, BTCV Cymru a Groundwork Cymru.

Prif nod y prosiect yw gwella ansawdd ardal Blaenau'r Cymoedd drwy alluogi'r cymunedau lleol i ysgwyddo cyfrifoldeb am eu hamgylchedd lleol. **Cymerodd 73 o grwpiau cymunedol ran yn y prosiect.**

Roedd gan y tri phartner wahanol rannau yn y prosiect: **Cadwch Gymru'n Daclus** oedd y partner arweiniol a oedd yn gyfrifol am gyllid y prosiect ac am yr adroddiadau amdano. Hwyl hefyd oedd yn hybu'r cymunedau i ganfod manau a hagrwyd gan sbwriel ac ymateb i'r problemau hynny, a hwy oedd yn goruchwylio'r rhaglenni gwaith glanhau. Bu **Groundwork Cymru'n** gweithredu cynlluniau gwella amgylcheddol mewn safleoedd penodol a **BTCV Cymru** oedd yn gyfrifol am oruchwylio'r hyfforddiant oedd yn rhan o'r prosiect.



site-specific environmental improvement schemes and **BTCV Cymru** were responsible for overseeing the training component of the project.

KWT worked with **1451** volunteers involved in a total of **504** practical improvement events, resulting in the removal of **64** tonnes of waste. **KWT** also co-ordinated **seven** large, partnership events in 'unadopted' areas, resulting in the removal of **11** tonnes of waste and **92** bags of rubbish. In addition to this, **32** sites were cleansed by contractors resulting in the removal of **30 tonnes** of waste. These sites consisted mainly of flytips.

As part of the project, small grants were available to groups to enable them to purchase necessary materials and equipment. **23** community groups were successful in their applications.

BTCV carried out training needs assessments for **40** community groups. **33** training events were held during 2008/09 with **285** individual volunteers gaining new skills. **Groundwork Wales** co-ordinated the transformation of **14** Green spaces sites which were improved for community benefit. These included: Penderyn Community Garden (RCT), Cwmbach Community Woodland (RCT), St Tydfil's Court (MT), Cwmtillery Scout Hall (BG), Duffryn View Bulb Planting (Caerphilly), Cwmdare Community Greenspace (RCT), Garden of Hope (BG), Prospect Green (RCT), Aberbargoed Community Christmas Tree (Caerphilly), Salvation Army Garden (MT), Trevor Rowsen Memorial Park (BG), Dowlais Cwm (MT), Pontnewynydd Baths (Torfaen), Pontnewynydd Gateway Mural (Torfaen).

Cydweithiodd **CGD** gyda **1451** o wirfoddolwyr a fu'n cymryd rhan mewn **504** o ddigwyddiadau ymarferol i wella'r amgylchedd a chliriwyd **64** tunnell o wastraff. Cydlynodd **CGD saith** o ddigwyddiadau mawr partneriaethol mewn ardaloedd nad oedd wedi eu 'mabwysiadu' a chliriwyd **11** tunnell o wastraff a llond **92** o fagiau o sbwriel. Yn ogystal â hynny cliriodd contractwyr **32** o safleoedd gan glirio **30 tunnell** o wastraff. Tipiau anghyfreithlon oedd y rhan fwyaf o'r rhain.

Roedd grantiau bach ar gael i grwpiau fel rhan o'r prosiect i'w galluogi i brynu deunyddiau ac offer angenrheidiol. Llwyddodd **23** o grwpiau cymunedol i gael grant. Cynhaliodd **BTCV** asesiadau anghenion hyfforddiant ar gyfer **40** o grwpiau cymunedol. Cynhaliwyd **33** o ddigwyddiadau hyfforddi yn ystod 2008/09 a dysgodd **285** o wirfoddolwyr sgiliau newydd.

Groundwork Cymru fu'n cydlynu'r gwaith o drawsnewid **14** o safleoedd gwyrdd a gafodd eu gwella er lles y cymunedau. Roedd y rhain yn cynnwys: Gardd Gymunedol Penderyn (RhCT), Coetir Cymunedol Cwmbach (RhCT), Cwrt Sant Tudful (MT), Neuadd y Sgowtiaid Cwmtlyeri (BG), Plannu bylbiau yn Dyffryn View (Caerffili), Tir Gwyrdd Cymunedol Cwmdâr (RhCT), Gardd Gobaith (BG), Prospect Green (RhCT), Coeden Nadolig Gymunedol Aberbargod (Caerffili), Gardd Byddin yr Iachawdwriaeth (MT), Parc Coffa Trevor Rowsen (BG), Cwm Dowlais (MT), Baddonau Pontnewynydd (Torfaen), Murlun Porth Pontnewynydd (Torfaen).

Green Communities Project

The Green Communities Project is built upon a partnership between Keep Wales Tidy and An Taisce in Ireland.

It was developed through ‘Clean Coasts’, a previous Interreg project. As the name suggests the previous project was geographically restricted to coastal areas and focused primarily on beach and marine borne litter.

The Green Communities Project has allowed both organisations to focus on broader more sustainable development issues throughout the wider community.

The aim of the project is to support communities to improve the environmental value of their ‘adopted area’ and raise awareness of climate change. They do this by measuring their carbon footprint and by making changes within their group’s activities they aim to reduce carbon production in Wales and Ireland.

An essential element of the Project is the exchange of knowledge, ideas and best practice between groups in both countries. Groups with similar interests are able to ‘twin’, enabling them to visit each other’s country and be involved in practical activities.

One such exchange took place in Ceredigion in January 2009. Clwb Syrffio BICA from Llangrannog, Ceredigion invited T Bay surfers from Tramore, Ireland to join them in a weekend of environmental improvements with maybe just a bit of surfing thrown in for fun.

Bearing in mind the ethos of the project the T Bay surfers travelled to Wales by ferry and used a mini bus whilst travelling in the county keeping their carbon emissions as low as possible.

Y Prosiect Cymunedau Gwyrdd

Mae’r Prosiect Cymunedau Gwyrdd wedi ei seilio ar bartneriaeth rhwng Cadwch Gymru’n Daclus ac An Taisce yn Iwerddon.

Fe’i datblygwyd trwy ‘Arfordir Glân’, sef prosiect Interreg blaenorol. Fel yr awgryma’r enw roedd y prosiect blaenorol hwnnw’n ymwneud yn unig ag ardaloedd arfordirol ac yn canolbwyntio’n bennaf ar sbwriel ar y traeth a sbwriel a ddaw o’r môr.

Mae’r Prosiect Cymunedau Gwyrdd wedi caniatáu i’r ddau sefydliad ganolbwyntio ar faterion datblygu sydd yn fwy cynaliadwy a hynny drwy’r gymuned ehangach.

Nod y prosiect yw cynorthwyo cymunedau i wella gwerth amgylcheddol yr ardal y maent wedi ei ‘mabwysiadu’ a chodi ymwybyddiaeth o’r newid yn yr hinsawdd. Maent yn gwneud hyn drwy fesur eu hól troed carbon, a thrwy wneud newidiadau yn arferion eu grŵp maent yn bwriadu sicrhau y cynhyrchir llai o garbon yng Nghymru ac Iwerddon.

Un elfen hanfodol o’r Prosiect yw bod y grwpiau yn y ddwy wlad yn cyfnewid gwybodaeth, syniadau ac arferion da. Mae grwpiau sydd â diddordebau tebyg i’w gilydd yn medru ‘gefeillio’ gan eu galluogi i ymweld â gwlad y grŵp arall a chymryd rhan mewn gweithgareddau ymarferol.

Aeth un daith gyfnewid o’r fath i Geredigion yn Ionawr 2009. Gwahoddodd Clwb Syrffio BICA o Llangrannog, Ceredigion syrffwyr T Bay o Tramore yn Iwerddon i ymuno â hwy ar benwythnos o waith yn gwneud gwelliannau amgylcheddol gyda rhyw fymryn o syrffio yma ac acw hefyd.

Yn unol ag ethos y prosiect teithiodd syrffwyr T Bay i Gymru ar long fferi a bws mini gan allyrru cyn lleied o garbon ag yr oedd modd.

Over the weekend a stretch of the Teifi estuary and local beaches were given a facelift. The surfers were joined by sixty local volunteers from groups including Hafan Hedd, QinetiQ, Poppit Lifeguard Club, Ceredigion County Council, Aberystwyth Surf Club and Teifi Yacht club. The clean ups were a great success with 122 bags of rubbish being collected, along with many large objects which were unable to be bagged. Jenny Higgins from the Countryside Council of Wales kindly delivered a talk on the biodiversity of the Teifi estuary to participants.

It was not all hard work and no play! There were plenty of opportunities for some surfing, and the Celtic wave surf competition took place where BICA surf club claimed the title over T Bay surfers in emphatic fashion. That was followed by a BBQ and open mike night with both Welsh and Irish volunteers taking turns on the mike and guitars.

A lot of environmental work took place with both parties learning a great deal from working with each other. A sustainable link between the groups has been created and will continue to flourish as the project progresses.

Cyflwynodd Jenny Higgins, Cyngor Cefn Gwlad Cymru, anerchiad i'r gwirfoddolwyr ar foamrywiaeth aber yr Afon Teifi.

Ni fu'n gyfnod o waith heb amser i ymlacio chwaith! Cafwyd cyfle i syrffio a chynhaliwyd cystadleuaeth y Celtic Wave. Yr enillwyr amlwg oedd clwb syrffio BICA. Yna cynhaliwyd barbeciw a noson meic agored gyda'r Cymry a'r Gwyddelod yn cymryd eu tro gyda'r meic a gitâr.

Gwnaed llawer iawn o waith amgylcheddol a dysgodd y ddau grŵp lawer drwy weithio gyda'i gilydd. Mae dolen gyswllt gynaliadwy wedi ei ffurfio rhwng y grwpiau a bydd yn parhau i ffynnu tra bydd y prosiect yn parhau.

Environment Wales

Throughout Wales in 2008-2009 Environment Wales awarded 131 grants totalling £602,802 to groups and other worthy applicants.

Environment Wales is a partnership of organisations from the voluntary sector, funded by the Welsh Assembly Government. The aim is to contribute to sustainable development by supporting, enthusing volunteers and community groups to protect and improve the environment of Wales through educational, awareness raising and practical project work.

This unique initiative is made up of a number of environmental organisations; these include BTCV Cymru, Cymad, Cylch, Groundwork Wales, Keep Wales Tidy, the National Trust, Wildlife Trust Wales and the Welsh Council for Voluntary Action (WCVA) as administrative core partner. Each organisation has a dedicated Development Officer based with them.

The Environment Wales Development Officer remains a constant point of contact for the groups, as once a voluntary group is registered it is possible that they can come forward to the initiative for funding, guidance and support to further develop their project.

Yn ystod 2008–2009, dosbarthodd Amgylchedd Cymru gyfanswm o £602,802 ledled Cymru ar ffurf 131 o grantiau i grwpiau ac ymgeiswyr llwyddiannus eraill.

Partneriaeth yw Amgylchedd Cymru rhwng sefydliadau o’r sector gwirfoddol, ac fe’i ariennir gan Lywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru. Mae Swyddog Datblygu Amgylchedd Cymru bob amser yn bwynt cyswllt i’r grwpiau oherwydd, unwaith y cofrestra grŵp gwirfoddol, gall ddod at y fenter am arian, cyfarwyddyd a chefnogaeth i ddatblygu eu prosiect.



Environment Wales also operates five grant streams to support voluntary organisations and community groups undertaking practical projects that promote one or more of the following objectives:

- to achieve sustainable improvements to the Welsh environment through practical projects;
- to increase understanding of sustainable development and the environment through information, education and advisory services;
- to help create new environmental initiatives which also allow communities and voluntary organisations to contribute to their social and economic needs;
- to support and train staff and volunteers engaged in these activities.

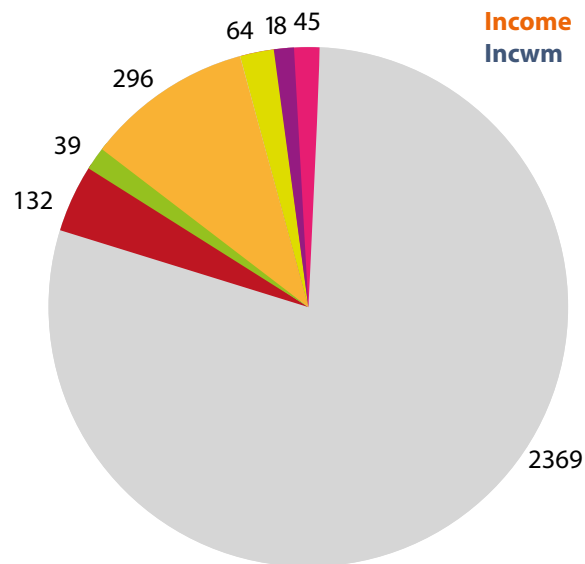

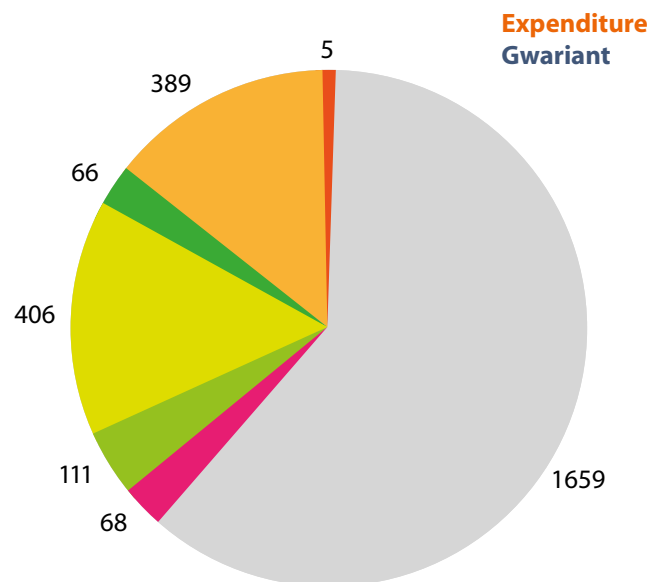
